

GED (HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENT) TEST INFORMATION

What is the GED/HSE Test?

The GED/HSE is a four-subject high school equivalency test that measures skills required by high schools and requested by colleges and employers. The four subjects are: Science (90 minutes), Social Studies (70 minutes), Mathematical Reasoning (115 minutes/3-minute break), and Reasoning Through Language Arts (150 minutes/10-minute break). The GED/HSE test is now offered only on the computer. Computer skills will be necessary and our Adult Education Teachers can assist you with any technical challenges. After you pass the GED/HSE test, your diploma or credential will be issued by the State. You'll receive a GED transcript to apply to college, start training, or get a better job!

Registration:

Create an account at www.myged.com and you will get information about local policies, how to request modified testing conditions (accommodations), or schedule your test. Scheduling is available 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Log in and click on "schedule test" on the top. Once you complete the scheduling questions you'll be directed to choose your language, subject, and the day and time that works best for you to test. You will have the option to schedule one test at a time as you are prepared to test. You must sign up 24 hours prior to the day you wish to test.

Cost:

The tests are \$37.50 per subject and are non-refundable. You can schedule, reschedule, or cancel from your account at www.myged.com. You must pay with a credit/debit card or a voucher purchased from ETC when registering for testing.
